

Want to locum in rural Australia?

Eligibility Criteria

Specialist Obstetrician Locum Must have a RANZCOG Fellowship.

GP Obstetrician Locum Must have a DRANZCOG or DRANZCOG Advanced qualification.

Specialist Anaesthetist Locum Must have an ANZCA Fellowship.

GP Anaesthetist Locum Must be currently registered as a medical practitioner, and a General Practitioner; and have undergone appropriate training endorsed by the JCCA, ACRRM or RACGP.

All ROALS locums must be participating in their relevant Continuing Professional Development (CPD) program.

Register as a ROALS locum

All ROALS locums must register with the scheme and submit a current CV with the contact details of two referees.

Locum vacancy notices will be advertised on the ROALS website.

Need a break?

ROALS can provide funding for 14 days of subsidised locum relief per Host, per financial year plus locum travel costs. Funding for locum travel is paid on a per placement basis.

A ROALS Host is an individual specialist obstetrician or anaesthetist and GP obstetrician or anaesthetist in the public and/or private sector located in rural and remote Australia (ASGC-RA 2 to 5).

Hospital administrators (in consultation with the Host) are able to apply for locum relief on behalf of their obstetrician and anaesthetist.

Apply for a ROALS locum

Applications for locum relief can be submitted to the ROALS Secretariat on the appropriate application form located on the ROALS website.

Hosts are eligible to receive 14 days of subsidised support per financial year, which may be taken as one placement or a number of shorter placements.



Supporting the rural obstetric and anaesthetic workforce

Eligibility Criteria

Specialist Obstetrician Host Must have a RANZCOG Fellowship, or be an Overseas Trained Specialist or be in an Area of Need position.

GP Obstetrician Host Must be credentialed to practise obstetrics in Australia.

Specialist Anaesthetist Host Must have an ANZCA Fellowship, or be an Overseas Trained Specialist or be in an Area of Need position.

GP Anaesthetist Host Must be credentialed to practise anaesthesia in Australia.
